Concept Note

Discrimination, Exclusion and Human Rights

Human Rights are those rights which individuals possess by virtue of being human beings. We live in an era of rights and entitlements. Many of the contemporary socio-economic and cultural problems are sought to be addressed on a rights-based approach. And yet we find gross violation of the rights of the individuals and groups all around leading to discrimination and consequent social exclusion of different dimensions. The Issue of protection of Human Rights and identifying agencies of discrimination has been central to human civilization, government and civil society initiatives. Discrimination and exclusion in both overt and covert forms have been rampant in the society through ages.
